Process to Identify Consultant

Request for Proposals

- Staff issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) in April 2024 and City Council approved their contract in July 2024.
- The RFP invited qualified entities to submit their proposals for consideration to receive grant funding. Applicants were required to demonstrate that they could meet the requirements of the grants, and provide a detailed scope of work to complete the project within the grant timeframe.
- City received 5 qualified proposals. A review panel of staff from Public Works, Municipal Utilities, and Community Development scored the proposals and ultimately recommended AECOM due to their extensive experience in creating CAPs, and their experience in helping other cities with the same CPRG grants.

Objectives for the CCAAP



Provide a high-level vision and detailed plans to implement meaningful climate action over the next decade, and establish metrics to determine the success of the CCAAP over time.



Focus on achieving climate justice by focusing on communities that have been the most adversely affected by negative environmental conditions.



Community involvement is imperative to ensure the CCAAP is responsive to local needs and that it takes into account the unique histories and experiences of Stockton's diverse communities.

- Phase 1 Planning Grants
 (Discretionary) awarded to
 metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs)
 to develop:
 - Priority Climate Action Plan (PCAP)
 - Comprehensive Climate Action Plan (CCAP)
 - Status Report
- Phase 2 Implementation Grants (Competitive):
- \$4.3 billion awarded in 2024 for 25 projects around the US








Greenhouse Gas Emissions Analysis

- Design strategies that increase benefits to LIDACs







Climate Vulnerability & Risk Assessment







