






OVERALL SITE PLAN ST. MARY'S DINING ROOM SAFE SHELTER MASTER PLAN Stockton, California

### Cost

#### \$14 million capital cost

#### RECOMMENDATIONS



- 1. Authorize the City Manager, or designee, to submit an application for \$6,500,000 a one-time capital grant through the County of San Joaquin ("County") to support the creation of the Pathways shelter program for homeless individuals in partnership with St. Mary's Dining Room ("Pathways Program")
- 2. Authorize the City Manager, or designee, to enter into, execute, and deliver all documents required or deemed necessary or appropriate with the County.
- 3. Authorize the City Manager, or designee to accept and appropriate grant revenues and expenditures.
- 4. Authorize the commitment of \$3,600,000 of American Rescue Plan Act funds, and, upon approval from the County, total County grant funds, to St. Mary's Dining Room for daily costs associated with creating and operating the Pathways Program.
- 5. Authorize the City Manager, or designee, to take appropriate and necessary actions to carry out the purpose and intent of this motion, including executing agreements and other documents with the County and St. Mary's Dining Room.
