STOCKTON CITY COUNCIL

RESOLUTION ACCCEPTING AND APPROPRIATING GRANT FUNDING FROM THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES TO REHABILITATE THE STOCKTON CHANNEL BUBBLER SYSTEM AND OTHER IMPROVEMENTS

In 2006, the City of Stockton Municipal Utilities Department installed a Destratification (Bubbler System) in McLeod Lake and the Stockton Channel to help improve water quality and control the formation of harmful algal blooms; and

After operating for nearly 20 years, the Bubbler System needs to be repaired because it has experienced reduced effectiveness due to structural deterioration and mechanical damage to the equipment; and

The City of Stockton Municipal Utilities Department also plans to install a trash boom near Morelli Park to help control trash in the waterways from unhoused encampments along Mormon Slough; and

Both projects were selected by State Senator Susan Talamantes Eggman for Department of General Services grant funding under Senate Bill No. 102; and

The Department of General Services, through the Office of Public School Construction and Senate Bill No. 102, has awarded a \$3,000,000 grant to the City of Stockton Municipal Utilities Department to help fund these projects; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOCKTON, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The City of Stockton accepts and appropriates grant funds in the amount of \$3,000,000 from the California Department of General Services Office of Public School Construction.
- 2. The City Manager, or designee, is hereby authorized and directed to allocate funds in accordance with the requirements of the Grant Agreement, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit 1 and incorporated by this reference.
